DECLARATION OF DISINTERESTEDNESS OF ADELMAN MATZ, P.C. PURSUANT TO THE ORDER (I) AUTHORIZING THE DEBTORS TO RETAIN AND COMPENSATE PROFESSIONALS IN THE ORDINARY COURSE OF BUSINESS EFFECTIVE AS OF THE PETITION DATE, (II) WAIVING CERTAIN INFORMATION REQUIREMENTS OF LOCAL RULE 2016-1, AND (III) GRANTING RELATED RELIEF

- I, Sarah M. Matz, declare under penalty of perjury:
- 1. I am a partner of Adelman Matz, P.C. located at 800 Third Avenue, 25<sup>th</sup> Floor, New York, New York 10017 (the "Firm").
- 2. AGDP Holding Inc. and its debtor affiliates, as debtors and debtors in possession (collectively, the "<u>Debtors</u>") in the above-captioned chapter 11 cases (these "<u>Chapter 11 Cases</u>"), have requested that the Firm provide legal services in connection with trademark registration and maintenance services to the Debtors, as well as serving as litigation counsel to the Debtors in the S.D.N.Y. suit *Avant Gardner, LLC v. Manhattan Mirage, et al.*, Case No. 7:25-cv-948 (AS), and the Firm has consented to provide such services.
- 3. The Firm may have performed services in the past, may currently perform services, and may perform services in the future in matters unrelated to these Chapter 11 Cases for persons

that are parties in interest in these Chapter 11 Cases. The Firm, however, does not perform services for any such person in connection with these Chapter 11 Cases, or have any relationship with any such person, their attorneys, or accountants that would be adverse to the Debtors or their estates.

- 4. As part of its customary practice, the Firm is retained in cases, proceedings, and transactions involving many different parties, some of whom may represent or be employed by the Debtors, claimants, and parties in interest in these Chapter 11 Cases.
- 5. Neither I nor any partner of, or professional employed by, the Firm has agreed to share or will share any portion of the compensation to be received from the Debtors with any other person other than the principal and regular employees of the Firm.
- 6. Neither I nor any principal, partner, director, officer of, or professional employed by, the Firm, insofar as I have been able to ascertain, holds or represents any interest adverse to the Debtors or their estates with respect to the matter(s) upon which the Firm is to be employed.
- 7. The Firm's current customary hourly rates, subject to change from time to time, are \$225.00 to \$950.00 for attorneys, and \$200.00 to \$300.00 for paralegals and legal assistants. In the normal course of business, the Firm revises its regular hourly rates and advises that, effective January 1 of each year, the aforementioned rates will be revised to the regular hourly rates that will be in effect at that time.
  - 8. The Firm is currently owed \$41,879.98 on account of prepetition services.
- 9. I also understand the limitations on compensation and reimbursement of expenses under the order authorizing the compensation of ordinary course professionals [D.I. 133] (the "OCP Order"). Specifically, the Firm understands that in the event its fees and expenses exceed the OCP Cap (as defined in the OCP Order), on average, over a rolling three-month period, the Firm will be required to file with the Court a fee application for approval of its fees and

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expenses for such month in accordance with Bankruptcy Code sections 330 and 331, the

Bankruptcy Rules, the Local Rules, and any applicable procedures or orders of the Court.

10. As of the Petition Date, which was the date on which the Debtors commenced these

Chapter 11 Cases, the Firm was not party to an agreement for indemnification with the Debtors.

11. The Firm is conducting further inquiries regarding its retention by any creditors of

the Debtors, and upon conclusion of that inquiry, or at any time during the period of its

employment, if the Firm should discover any facts bearing on the matters described herein, the

Firm will supplement the information contained in this declaration.
