## Supporting Statement - Natalie Durden

I was employed by Hansen Air Pros, a division of Air Pros LLC, from August 7, 2023 to November 2023 as a Purchasing Coordinator earning \$17/hour. Despite this title, I was expected to take on responsibilities typically assigned to multiple roles. These included technician scheduling, permit management, dispatch coordination, and direct communication with customers and county offices.

In addition to those duties, I also processed customer financing applications and secured approvals that generated profit for the company. I was explicitly told I would receive bonuses for successful financing approvals and additional pay for working weekend shifts, neither of which were ever fulfilled. Over time, it became clear that the compensation I was promised would not be honored, and I resigned in November 2023 as a result of these ongoing false promises.

My 2023 W-2 confirms I earned only \$7,769 during my time there. Given the scope of work I performed, and the fact that I now earn over \$70,000 annually in a similar position elsewhere, this wage was far below market value. I am seeking \$2,800 in unpaid compensation. While the amount I'm truly owed is likely higher, I have limited my claim due to the employer's lack of documentation and my previous time lost attempting to resolve this internally. Documentation confirming my hire date, duties performed, and income has been attached.
