For the debtor listed above, a case has been filed under chapter 11 of the Bankruptcy Code. An order for relief has been entered.

This notice has important information about the case for creditors, debtors, and trustees, including information about the meeting of creditors and deadlines. Read all pages carefully.

The filing of the case imposed an automatic stay against most collection activities (see Bankruptcy Code §362 for prohibited collection actions). This means that creditors generally may not take action to collect debts from the debtor, from the debtor's property, or from certain codebtors. For example, while the stay is in effect, creditors cannot sue, assert a deficiency, repossess property, or otherwise try to collect from the debtor. Creditors cannot demand repayment from the debtor by mail, telephone, or otherwise. Creditors who violate the stay can be required to pay actual and punitive damages and attorney's fees. Under certain circumstances, the stay may be limited to 30 days or not exist at all, although debtors can ask the Court to extend or impose a stay.

Confirmation of a chapter 11 plan may result in a discharge of debt. A creditor who wants to have a particular debt excepted from discharge may be required to file a complaint in the Bankruptcy Clerk's Office within the deadline specified in this notice. (See section number 11 below for more information.)

To protect your rights, consult an attorney. All documents filed in the case may be inspected at the bankruptcy clerk's office at the address listed below or through PACER (Public Access to Court Electronic Records at www.pacer.gov).

The staff of the Bankruptcy Clerk's Office cannot give legal advice.

Do not file this notice with any Proof of Claim or other filing in the case.



A Proof of Claim form is not included with this notice. You can obtain one at any Bankruptcy Clerk's Office, or by visiting www.uscourts.gov.</p> <p>Your Claim will be allowed in the amount scheduled unless:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • your claim is designated as <i>disputed</i>, <i>contingent</i>, or <i>unliquidated</i>; • you file a Proof of Claim in a different amount; or • you receive another notice. <p>If your claim is not scheduled or if your claim is designated as <i>disputed</i>, <i>contingent</i>, or <i>unliquidated</i>, you must file a Proof of Claim or you might not be paid on your claim and you might be unable to vote on a plan. You will receive notice of the date of the confirmation hearing, and you may object to confirmation of the plan and attend the confirmation hearing. Unless a trustee is serving, the debtor will remain in possession of the property and may continue to operate its business.</p>	
<p>11.Discharge of debts</p>	<p>Confirmation of a chapter 11 plan may result in a discharge of debts, which may include all or part of your debt. See 11 U.S.C. § 1141(d). However, unless the Court orders otherwise, the debts will not be discharged until all payments under the plan are made. A discharge means that creditors may never try to collect the debt from the debtor except as provided in the plan. If you want to have a particular debt owed to you excepted from the discharge under 11 U.S.C. § 1141(d)(6)(A), you must file a complaint and pay the filing fee by the deadline.</p>
