I. <u>Basis for the Claim</u>

Prior to June 4, 2023 (the "<u>Petition Date</u>"), AppSmart and Cyxtera Communications, LLC (the "<u>Debtor</u>") entered into a Referral Agreement dated November 30, 2018 (the "<u>Agreement</u>"), pursuant to which, among other things, the Debtor agreed to pay AppSmart for certain referral services that AppSmart provided to the Debtor.¹

On July 19, 2023, the Bankruptcy Court entered an *Order (I) Authorizing the Rejection of Certain Executory Contracts, Each Effective as of the Rejection Date and (II) Granting Related Relief* [Docket No. 299] pursuant to which the Debtor rejected the Agreement effective as of June 4, 2023.

II. Amount, Classification and Nature of Claim

As of the Petition Date, the Debtor was indebted to AppSmart in the amount of \$92,537.41, on account of unpaid prepetition account balances for referral fees owed pursuant to the Agreement in the amount of \$92,537.41 per month. The Debtor further is indebted to AppSmart for an additional \$8,883,590.88 arising from the rejection of the Agreement. Rejection damages were calculated based on the commissions owed under the Agreement for the next eight years, which is the average term of customers that the Debtors were obligated to pay referrals for under the Agreement. AppSmart's total claim is \$8,976,128.29 (the "Claim"). The Claim is unsecured.
