# Trump vows to use tariffs to regain 'stolen' wealth

The European Union announces measures to counter U.S. taxes on steel, aluminum.

WASHINGTON — President Trump openly challenged U.S. allies Wednesday by increasing tariffs on all steel and aluminum imports to 25% as he vowed to take back wealth "stolen" by other countries, drawing quick retaliation from Europe and Canada.

The Republican president's use of tariffs to extract concessions from other nations points toward a possibly destructive trade war and a stark change in America's approach to global leadership. It also has destabilized the stock market and stoked anxiety about an economic downturn.

"The United States of America is going to take back a lot of what was stolen from it by other countries and, frankly, by incompetent U.S. leadership," Trump told reporters. "We're going to take back our wealth, and we're going to take back a lot of the companies that left."

Trump removed all exemptions from his 2018 tariffs on the metals, in addition to increasing the tariffs on aluminum from 10%. His moves, based on a February directive, are part of a broader effort to disrupt and transform global commerce.

He has separate tariffs on Canada, Mexico and China, with plans to also tax imports from the European Union, Brazil and South Korea by charging "reciprocal" rates starting April 2.

The EU announced its countermeasures own Wednesday. European Commission President Ursula von der Leyen said that as the United States was "applying tariffs worth \$28 billion, we are responding with countermeasures worth 26 billion euros," or about \$28 billion. Those measures, which cover not just steel and aluminum products but also textiles, home appliances and agricultural goods, are due to take effect April 1.

U.S. Trade Representative Jamieson Greer responded by saving that the

States ran an \$87-billion trade imbalance with Ireland. That's partially because of the tax structure created by Trump's 2017 overhaul, which incentivized U.S. pharmaceutical companies to record their sales abroad, Brad Setser, a senior fellow at the Council of Foreign Relations, said on X.

Canada sees itself as locked in a trade war under the pretext that it's a center for fentanyl smuggling and that its natural resources and factories subtract from the U.S. economy instead of supporting it.

"This is going to be a dayto-day fight. This is now the second round of unjustified tariffs leveled against Canada," Canadian Foreign Minister Melanie Joly said. "The latest excuse is national security despite the fact that Canada's steel and aluminum adds to America's security. All the while there is a threat of further and broader tariffs on April 2 still looming. The excuse for those tariffs shifts every day."

nies to invest in U.S. factories. The 8% drop in the Standard & Poor's 500 stock index over the last month on fears of deteriorating growth appears unlikely to dissuade him, as Trump argued that higher tariff rates would be more effective at bringing back factories.

"The higher it goes, the more likely it is they're going to build," Trump told the group. "The biggest win is if they move into our country and produce jobs. That's a bigger win than the tariffs themselves, but the tariffs are going to be throwing off a lot of money to this country."

Trump on Tuesday had threatened to put tariffs of 50% on steel and aluminum from Canada, but he chose to stay with the 25% rate after the province of Ontario suspended plans to put a surcharge on electricity sold to Michigan, Minnesota and New York.

Democratic lawmakers dismissed Trump's claims that his tariffs are about national security and drug smuggling, saying they're actually about generating revenue to help cover the cost of his planned income tax cuts for the wealthy.

"Donald Trump knows his policies could wreck the economy, but he's doing it anyway," said Senate Minority Leader Chuck Schumer (D-N.Y.).

"Why are they doing all these crazy things that Americans don't like? One reason, and one reason alone: tax breaks for billionaires, the north star of the Republican Party's goals."

In many ways, the president is addressing what he

perceives as unfinished business from his first term. Trump meaningfully increased tariffs, but the revenue collected by the federal government was too small to significantly increase overall inflationary pressures.

Outside forecasts by the Yale University Budget Lab, Tax Policy Center and others suggest that U.S. families would have the costs of the taxes passed on to them in the form of higher prices.

With Wednesday's tariffs on steel and aluminum, Trump is seeking to remedy his original 2018 import taxes that were eroded by exemptions.

After Canada and Mexico agreed to his demand for a revamped North American trade deal in 2020, they avoided the import taxes on the metals. Other U.S. trading partners had import quotas supplant the tariffs. And the first Trump administration also allowed U.S. companies to request exemptions from the tariffs if, for instance, they couldn't find the steel they needed from domestic producers.

Although Trump's tariffs could help steel and aluminum plants in the United States, they could raise prices for the manufacturers that use the metals as raw materials.

Moreover, economists have found, the gains to the steel and aluminum industries were more than offset by the cost they imposed on "downstream" manufacturers that use their products.

At these downstream companies, production fell by nearly \$3.5 billion because of the tariffs in 2021, a loss that exceeded the \$2.3-billion uptick in production that year by aluminum producers and steelmakers, the U.S. International Trade Commission found in 2023.

Trump sees the tariffs as leading to more domestic factories, and the White House has noted that Volvo, Volkswagen and Honda are all exploring an increase to their U.S. footprint. But the prospect of higher prices, fewer sales and lower profits might cause some companies to refrain from investing in new facilities.

"If you're an executive in the boardroom, are you really going to tell your board it's the time to expand that assembly line?" said John Murphy, senior vice president at the U.S. Chamber of Commerce.

The top steel exporters to the U.S. are Canada, Mexico, Brazil, South Korea and Japan, with exports from Taiwan and Vietnam growing at a fast pace, according to the International Trade Administration. Imports from China, the world's largest steel producer, account for only a small fraction of what the U.S. buys.

The lion's share of U.S. aluminum imports comes from Canada.

EPA to roll back landmark regulations

EU was punishing America instead of fixing what he viewed as excess capacity in steel and aluminum production.

"The EU's punitive action completely disregards the national security imperatives of the United States — and indeed international security — and is yet another indicator that the EU's trade and economic policies are out of step with reality," he said in a statement.

Meeting Wednesday with Ireland's prime minister, Micheal Martin, Trump said "of course" he wants to respond to the EU's retaliations and "of course" Ireland is taking advantage of the United States.

"The EU was set up in order to take advantage of the United States," Trump said. Last year, the United Canada is the largest foreign supplier of steel and aluminum to the United States and plans to impose retaliatory tariffs of \$20.7 billion starting Thursday in response to the U.S. taxes on the metals.

Canada's new tariffs would be on steel and aluminum products, as well as U.S. goods including computers, sports equipment and water heaters worth \$9.9 billion. That's in addition to the 25% countertariffs on \$20.8 billion of imports from the U.S. that were put in place March 4 in response to other Trump import taxes that he's partially delayed by a month.

Trump told chief executives in the Business Roundtable a day earlier that the tariffs were causing compa-

President Trump's new EPA administrator said Wednesday he was preparing to roll back dozens of landmark environmental rules, including those crucial to California programs on climate change and electric vehicles.

"We are driving a dagger straight into the heart of the climate change religion," EPA Administrator Lee Zeldin said in a news release.

One of the rules that Zeldin plans to overhaul is the agency's finding in 2009 that planet-warming greenhouse gases endanger public health. Known as the "endangerment finding," it is the legal underpinning for a host of climate regulations for motor vehicles, power plants and other sources of air pollution.

Environmental groups said they will fight the roll-backs.

"Today's announcement is only the start of the process — not the end," said Jackie Wong, senior vice president for climate and energy at the Natural Resources Defense Council. "Before finalizing any of these actions, the law says EPA must propose its changes, justify them with science and the law, and listen to the public and respond to its concerns."

"At a time when millions of Americans are trying to rebuild after horrific wildfires and climate-fueled hurricanes, it's nonsensical to try to deny that climate change harms our health and welfare," Wong said.

In all, Zeldin said, he is taking steps to unwind 31 environmental rules, calling it "the most consequential day of deregulation in American history."

"WE ARE driving a dagger straight into the heart of the climate change religion," said EPA Administrator Lee Zeldin, shown at a news conference last month.

Among the rules to be overhauled are those restricting industrial pollution of mercury and other air toxins, as well as those limiting soot pollution and protecting wetlands.

"These actions will roll back trillions of dollars in regulatory costs and hidden taxes," Zeldin said. "As a result, the cost of living for American families will decrease, and essentials such as buying a car, heating your home and operating a business will become more affordable."

In a memo this week, Zeldin also said the agency was closing its environmental justice offices that had worked to lower pollution in poor communities. One of those offices was at the agency's regional location in San Francisco.

Zeldin said the action was in response to President Trump's executive order on "ending radical and wasteful government DEI programs and preferences," according to the memo, which was previously reported by the New York Times and CBS. Environmental groups said the work by the environmental justice offices had helped protect vulnerable communities, which studies have shown can face higher levels of pollution.

"Ending environmental justice efforts does not serve the American people. It does not accomplish anything meaningful towards the EPA's mission to protect our environment and keep our air and water clean," said Ben Jealous, executive director of the Sierra Club, in a statement. "There is only one purpose to Lee Zeldin's announcement: to allow big polluters to continue cutting corners."

The EPA established the Office of Environmental Justice in 1992 during the administration of Republican President George H.W. Bush.

Now known as the agency's Office of Environmental Justice and External Civil Rights, it was greatly expanded in 2022 under then-President Biden.

Since becoming the agency's administrator, Zeldin has canceled hun-

dreds of grants, including some meant to help poor communities.

"Working hand-in-hand with DOGE to rein in wasteful federal spending, EPA has saved more than \$2 billion in taxpayer money," Zeldin said in a statement on Monday, referring to Elon Musk's so-called Department of Government Efficiency. "It is our commitment at EPA to be exceptional stewards of tax dollars."

Last week, the EPA and the Justice Department dismissed a lawsuit against the corporate owner of a neoprene manufacturing plant in LaPlace, La. The withdrawal of the case was part of Zeldin's pledge to end the use of environmental justice "as a tool for advancing ideological priorities."

The Biden administration had sued Denka Performance Elastomer in 2023, alleging the plant had created an unacceptable risk of cancer to Black residents living nearby.

# Hamilton's Ferrari debut set for F1's 2025 opener

MELBOURNE - Lewis Hamilton will launch his bid to win the drivers' championship at a third Formula 1 team when he makes his much-anticipated debut for Ferrari in the season-opening Australian Grand Prix on Sunday.

Formula 1's most successful team has not won a championship since the 2008 constructors' title, and Hamilton, moving from Mercedes to Maranello, arrives chasing a record eighth.

Hamilton's switch has sent fans into a frenzy in Italy and Melbourne's big Italian community will be out in force at Albert Park as the lakeside circuit hosts the opener for the first time since 2019.

Ferrari, runners-up to McLaren in the 2024 constructors' championship, cele-



brated a 1-2 in Melbourne last year when Carlos Sainz, who has since moved to Williams, won the race ahead of teammate Charles Leclerc.

Hamilton McLaren may be set to

steal Hamilton's thunder after encouraging performances in winter testing with F1 data showing it was quickest on low fuel in Bahrain and had an advantage over Ferrari on race pace.

That would have been music to the ears of Australian fans cheering for McLaren's Oscar Piastri as he looks to become the first home driver to win the race since it was added to the F1 world championship calendar in 1985. The Melbourne native finished fourth last year at Albert Park behind third-placed teammate Lando Norris.

Briton Norris, the bookmakers' preseason favorite for the championship, may well be Piastri's biggest obstacle to a drought-breaking win for Australia.

Red Bull's defending champion Max Verstappen will launch his bid to become the second man to win five drivers' titles in a row following Michael Schumacher. Red Bull finished third in the constructors' championship last season. After doing the least amount of laps at winter testing, the pace of the car remains to be seen. "We learnt a lot from testing but there is still a lot more work to be done," Verstappen said in a race preview issued by Red Bull on Tuesday. "We have ideas about what we can do and how we can take on what we learned at testing, so we will see how we go when we start driving on the track."

Verstappen has a new teammate in

New Zealander Liam Lawson.

Lawson is among six drivers at Albert Park who will race in an F1 season-opener for the first time.

There will be plenty of interest in how 18-year-old Italian Andrea Kimi Antonelli fares in his F1 debut for Mercedes, having stepped into Hamilton's huge shoes at the Brackley-based team.

British teen rival Oliver Bearman will drive for Haas after being a reserve for the U.S. team last year, while young Frenchman Isack Hadjar, the F2 runnerup, will debut at Racing Bulls.

Brazilian F2 champion Gabriel Bortoleto will step up for struggling Sauber while Australia's Jack Doohan will hope to make an instant impression amid speculation he may only be warming the seat at Alpine for Argentine reserve driver Franco Colapinto.


