FIRST INTERIM AND FINAL FEE APPLICATION OF PORZIO, BROMBERG & NEWMAN, P.C. AS CO-COUNSEL FOR THE OFFICIAL COMMITTEE OF UNSECURED CREDITORS OF INVITAE CORPORATION, ET AL. FROM MARCH 8, 2024 THROUGH AND INCLUDING AUGUST 2, 2024

Porzio, Bromberg & Newman, P.C. ("Porzio"), as co-counsel to the Official Committee

of Unsecured Creditors (the "Committee") appointed in the chapter 11 cases (the "Chapter 11

<u>Cases</u>") of the above-captioned debtors and debtors-in-possession (collectively, the "<u>Debtors</u>")

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submits its first interim and final fee application (the "<u>Final Fee Application</u>") for an allowance of compensation for professional services rendered to the Committee and reimbursement of actual and necessary expenses incurred in connection with such service from March 8, 2024 through and including August 2, 2024 (the "<u>Compensation Period</u>"). By this Final Fee Application, Porzio seeks (a) allowance of compensation for services rendered in the amount of \$556,349.50 for the Compensation Period, (b) allowance of reimbursement of actual and necessary expenses in the amount of \$45,228.75 incurred during the Compensation Period, and (c) payment of all related unpaid amounts owing to Porzio. In support of this Final Fee Application, Porzio respectfully represents as follows:

JURISDICTION, VENUE, AND STATUTORY BASIS

 This Court has jurisdiction to consider this matter pursuant to 28 U.S.C. §§ 157 and 1334. Consideration of this Final Fee Application is a core proceeding pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 157(b). Venue is proper before this Court pursuant to 28 U.S.C. §§ 1408 and 1409.

BACKGROUND

2. On February 13, 2024, each of the Debtors filed a voluntary petition for relief under Chapter 11 of title 11 of the United States Code (the "Bankruptcy Code") with this Court.

3. On March 1, 2024, the Office of the United States Trustee for Regions 3 and 9, District of New Jersey (the "<u>United States Trustee</u>") appointed the Committee pursuant to section 1102(a)(1) of the Bankruptcy Code [Docket No. 131], consisting of the following three members: (i) Wilmington Savings Fund Society, Federal Savings Bank, (ii) Chimtech Holding Ltd., and (iii) Workday, Inc.

4. On March 5, 2024, the Committee selected White & Case LLP ("<u>White & Case</u>") as its primary counsel, subject to approval by the Court. On March 8, 2024, the Committee

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selected Porzio as co-counsel to White & Case, and Ducera Partners LLC as investment banker. On March 14, 2024, the Committee selected Province, LLC as financial advisor.

5. On April 4, 2024, the Committee filed an application to employ and retain Porzio as co-counsel to the Committee under sections 328(a) and 1102(a) of the Bankruptcy Code, effective as of the March 8, 2024 [Docket No. 273] (the "<u>Retention Application</u>").

6. On March 18, 2024, the Court entered the Administrative Fee Order Establishing Procedures for the Allowance and Payment of Interim Compensation and Reimbursement of Expenses of Professionals Retained by Order of this Court [Docket No. 187] (the "<u>Administrative Fee Order</u>"), which generally sets forth the procedures for interim compensation and expense reimbursement for all retained professionals in these Chapter 11 Cases.

On May 3, 2024, the Court entered the order granting the Retention Application
[Docket No. 430] (the "<u>Retention Order</u>"), effective as of March 8, 2024.

8. For services rendered during the Compensation Period, Porzio filed and served monthly fee statements [Docket Nos. 513, 545, 694, 879, and 978] (the "<u>Monthly Fee Statements</u>") seeking payment of 80% of its fees and 100% of its expenses. To date no objections have been filed with respect to the Monthly Fee Statements. As a result, pursuant to the Administrative Fee Order, Porzio has received payment of fees in the amount of \$445,079.47 and expenses in the amount of \$45,228.75 related to services provided in the Compensation Period.

9. On August 2, 2024, the Bankruptcy Court entered an Order [Docket No. 913] ("<u>Confirmation Order</u>") confirming the Debtors' *Third Amended Joint Plan of Invitae Corporation and Its Debtor Affiliates Pursuant to Chapter 11 of the Bankruptcy Code* [Docket No. 909] (with all supplements and exhibits thereto, the "<u>Plan</u>").

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10. On August 7, 2024, the Effective Date of the Plan occurred. See Notice Of (I) Entry of An Order Confirming the Third Amended Joint Chapter 11 Plan of Invitae Corporation And Its Debtor Affiliates Pursuant To Chapter 11 Of The Bankruptcy Code And (II) Occurrence Of The Effective Date, dated August 7, 2024 [Docket No. 932].

11. Pursuant to section II.B of the Plan and paragraph 93 of the Confirmation Order, all final requests for payment of Professional Fee Claims (as defined in the Plan) are required to be filed no later than forty-five (45) days after the Effective Date.

SUMMARY OF SERVICES RENDERED AND EXPENSES INCURRED DURING COMPENSATION PERIOD

12. Through this Final Fee Application, prepared in accordance with Rule 2016-1 of the Local Rules of the U.S. Bankruptcy Court for the District of New Jersey (the "Local <u>Bankruptcy Rules</u>"), this Court's Administrative Fee Order, and Appendix B of the *United States Trustee's Guidelines for Reviewing Applications for Compensation and Reimbursement of Expenses Filed Under 11 U.S.C. § 330 by Attorneys in Larger Chapter 11 Cases* (the "U.S. <u>Trustee Guidelines</u>"), Porzio respectfully requests final allowance and payment for professional services rendered during the Compensation Period in the amount of \$556,349.50, and final reimbursement of actual and necessary expenses incurred during the Compensation Period in the amount of \$45,228.75.

13. In accordance with the Local Bankruptcy Rules and the U.S. Trustee Guidelines, annexed to this Final Fee Application are the following Exhibits:

- **Exhibit A:** Customary And Comparable Compensation Disclosures With Fee Applications;
- **Exhibit B:** Summary of Timekeepers Included In This Fee Application;
- **Exhibit C:** Summary of Compensation Requested By Project Category;
- **Exhibit D:** Summary of Expense Reimbursement Requested By Category; and

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• **Exhibit E:** Summary Cover Sheet of Fee Application

14. Porzio attorneys and paraprofessionals expended a total of 828.10 hours during the Compensation Period, which is reflected in the accompanying Final Fee Application Cover Sheet.

15. Porzio submits that the compensation requested herein is reasonable based on the nature and extent of the services rendered, the complexity of this bankruptcy case, the time, labor, experience and specialized expertise provided by Porzio to the Committee, and other related factors. As a result, Porzio submits that the compensation sought herein is reasonable within the meaning of sections 330 and 331 of the Bankruptcy Code.

16. Porzio further submits that the professional services performed during the Compensation Period were necessary and appropriate to protect the rights and fulfill the obligations of unsecured creditors given the nature and complexity of the issues presented. The professional services performed by Porzio during the Compensation Period were in the best interests of the Debtors' unsecured creditors and were performed in an expeditious and efficient manner.

17. The following summary highlights the major areas in which Porzio rendered services during the Compensation Period:

<u>Asset Analysis and Recovery</u>

18. During the Compensation Period, Porzio expended time assisting in the investigation of potential claims and causes of action against the Debtors' prepetition creditors and insiders, including through document requests and witness interviews, regarding the Debtors, their business and certain prepetition transactions, and considered and analyzed potential causes of actions in respect thereof.

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Fees: \$152,759.50 Total Hours: 217.2

• Employment and Fee Applications

19. During the Compensation Period, Porzio expended time on preparing and filing various *pro hac vice* applications for the Committee's co-counsel, assisted in the preparation and filing of retention applications for the Committee's professionals, and assisted in the preparation and filing of monthly fee statements for the Committee's professionals.

Fees: \$134,248.50 Total Hours: 225.8

• <u>Meetings and Communications with Creditors</u>

20. During the Compensation Period, Porzio expended time on assisting with communications with the Committee through teleconferences, weekly meetings, and email correspondence regarding case strategy and the various motions and pleadings filed in the Chapter 11 Cases.

Fees: \$60,621.00 Total Hours: 77.8

• Plan and Disclosure Statement

21. During the Compensation Period, Porzio expended time reviewing the Plan and all related filings. In addition, Porzio negotiated with the Debtors and their professionals and the Debtors' secured creditors regarding the Plan settlement structure.

Fees: \$68,212.00 Total Hours: 98.4

22. In addition to the foregoing, Porzio incurred out-of-pocket expenses during the Second Interim Period in the amount of \$45,228.75, which were "actual, necessary expenses" in connection with rendering the professional services described above pursuant to section 330(a)(1)(B) of the Bankruptcy Code. A detailed list of the expenses Porzio has incurred during its representation of the Committee during the Compensation Period is summarized. Such

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expenses include, but are not limited to, telephone charges, postage, messenger service, Federal Express, legal research, travel expenses, search fees and photocopy charges. Porzio has made every effort to minimize the expenses in this matter by utilizing the most cost-efficient methods of communication consistent with the necessary time restraints.

CERTIFICATION OF COUNSEL

23. A Certification of Counsel is attached hereto as **Exhibit F**.

STATEMENTS IN RESPONSE TO U.S. TRUSTEE GUIDELINES

24. Porzio provides the following responses to the request for information set forth in

the U.S. Trustee Guidelines for the Compensation Period:

<u>Question</u>: Did you agree to any variations from, or alternatives to, your standard or customary billing rates, fees, or terms for services pertaining to this engagement that were provided during the Compensation Period?

Response: No.

<u>Question</u>: If the fees sought in this Final Fee Application as compared to the fees budgeted for the Compensation Period are higher by 10% or more, did you discuss the reasons for the variation with the client?

<u>Response</u>: Not applicable.

<u>Question</u>: Have any of the professionals included in this Fee Application varied their hourly rate based on the geographic location of the bankruptcy case?

Response: No.

<u>Question</u>: Does the Final Fee Application include time or fees related to reviewing or revising time records or preparing, reviewing, or revising invoices? (This is limited to work involved in preparing and editing billing records that would not be compensable outside of bankruptcy and does not include reasonable fees for preparing a fee application.) <u>Response</u>: The Final Fee Application includes approximately 7.5 hours and associated fees of approximately \$4,459.00 related to reviewing or revising time records or preparing, reviewing, or revising invoices for, among other things, privileged or confidential information. These tasks are

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performed concurrently by the same individuals and, thus, are not divisible on a task-by-task basis.

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CONCLUSION

WHEREFORE, for all of the foregoing reasons, Porzio respectfully requests (a) approving, on a final basis, the sum of \$556,349.50 for services rendered, plus \$45,228.75 for actual and necessary expenses incurred by Porzio as co-counsel to the Committee during the Compensation Period, (b) authorizing and directing the payment to Porzio of all allowed amounts for which Porzio has not previously received payment pursuant to the Administrative Fee Order; and (c) granting Porzio such other and further relief as the Court deems just and equitable.
