## **AFFIDAVIT**

- I, <u>Thomas Gibb</u>, hereby declare that the following is true to the best of my knowledge, information, and belief:
- 1. I am the Chief Compliance Officer of Murgitroyd & Company ("Murgitroyd") which maintains offices at 165-169 Scotland Street Glasgow G5 8PL United Kingdom (Headquarters Location), 4721 Emperor Blvd, Suite 430, Durham, NC 27703 (US Office) and other locations.
- 2. This Affidavit is submitted in connection with an Order of the United States Bankruptcy Court for the District of Utah dated June 16, 2023, authorizing the above-captioned debtors and debtors-in-possession (collectively, the "**Debtors**") to retain certain professionals in the ordinary course of business during the pendency of the Debtors' chapter 11 cases.
- 3. Murgitroyd, through me, and members of the firm, have represented and/or advised the Debtors as Legal Counsel with respect to certain aspects of the Debtors' business, including Intellectual Property Attorney support and Intellectual Property Services since January 20, 2018.
- 4. The Debtors have requested, and Murgitroyd has agreed, to continue to provide services to the Debtors with respect to such matters. Additionally, the Debtors have requested, and Murgitroyd proposes to render the following services to the Debtors during these chapter 11 cases: Docketing, paralegal services and trademark/patent prosecution and renewals.
- 5. Murgitroyd's current customary rates of \$250-\$575 per hour, subject to change from time to time, typically range from \$50 to \$2500 per month. In the normal course of business, Murgitroyd revises its regular rates on January 1st of each year and requests that, effective January 1st of each year, the aforementioned rates be revised to the regular rates which may be in effect at that time.

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- 6. To the best of my knowledge, formed after due inquiry, neither I, Murgitroyd, nor any employee thereof has any connection with the Debtors or currently represent any of their creditors, other parties-in-interest, the United States Trustee, or any person employed by the Office of the United States Trustee with respect to the matters upon which it is to be engaged, and Murgitroyd does not, by reason of any direct or indirect relationship to, connection with, or interest in the Debtors, hold or represent any interest adverse to the Debtors, their estates, or any class of creditors or equity interest holders.
- 7. Thus, I believe that Murgitroyd's work with such entities in matters entirely unrelated to the Debtors is not adverse to the Debtors' interests, or the interests of their creditors, or estates in respect of the matters for which Murgitroyd will be engaged, nor will such services impair Murgitroyd's ability to represent the Debtors in the ordinary course in these chapter 11 cases.
- 8. In addition, although unascertainable at this time after due inquiry, due to the magnitude of the Debtors' potential universe of creditors and Murgitroyd's clients, Murgitroyd may have in the past represented, currently represent, and may in the future represent entities that are claimants of the Debtors in matters entirely unrelated to the Debtors and their estates. Murgitroyd does not and will not represent any such entity in connection with these pending chapter 11 cases and does not have any relationship with any such entity, attorneys, or accountants that would be adverse to the Debtors or their estates.
- 9. In the past year, Murgitroyd has rendered services that have not yet been billed or that have been billed but with respect to which payment has not yet been received. Murgitroyd is currently owed \$0 on account of such prepetition services.

- 10. Subject to section 327(e) of the Bankruptcy Code, Murgitroyd has in the past represented the Debtors and is owed prepetition fees related to that representation. Murgitroyd's prepetition services are not directly related to the representation Murgitroyd will provide Debtors during the course of these pending chapter 11 cases. Thus, I believe that Murgitroyd's prepetition fees are not adverse to the Debtors' interests, or the interests of their creditors, or estates in respect of the matters for which Murgitroyd will be engaged, and it will be in the best interest of the Debtor's estates to employ Murgitroyd during the ordinary course in these chapter 11 cases.
