RESPONSE IN OPPOSITION TO DISTRIBUTION TRUSTEE'S FIFTH OMNIBUS (SUBSTANTIVE) OBJECTION TO <u>CERTAIN CONTINGENT AND UNLIQUIDATED CLAIMS</u>

The City of Philadelphia, (the "City"), through its counsel, Megan N. Harper, Divisional Deputy City Solicitor, hereby responds in opposition to Distribution Trustee's Fifth Omnibus (Substantive) Objection to Certain Contingent and Unliquidated Claims [Docket No. 1476] (the "Fifth Omnibus Objection") and in support thereof, states as follows:

Background

1. On November 24, 2023, the City filed Claim No. 1212 (the "Claim"), which amended the City's timely filed Claim No. 156. A true and correct copy of the Claim is attached hereto as Exhibit A.

2. The Claim includes unliquidated quarterly Wage Tax liability incurred by Proterra

Operating Company Inc. ("Proterra") for the quarters ending March 31, 2023 and June 30, 2023.²

3. On November 26, 2024, the Distribution Trustee filed the Fifth Omnibus Objection

asserting that the Claim lacks sufficient information to determine its value.

² The Claim also includes an unliquidated claim for 2021 Business Income and Receipts Tax, which has since been resolved.

Argument

4. The City is authorized to collect Wage Tax in accordance with Philadelphia Code § 19-1500. Wage Tax is a tax on salaries, wages, commissions, and other compensation. Phila. Code § 19-1502. Employers are required to withhold the Wage Tax from all employees who are either a resident of Philadelphia or a non-resident of Philadelphia who performs services for an employer in Philadelphia. Phila. Code §§ 19-1502 and 19-1504. The Department of Revenue's Income Tax Regulations determine the tax rate for Wage Tax. In 2023, the rate was 3.79% for residents and 3.44% for non-residents.

5. The Claim includes information that provides sufficient indicia of its *prima facie* validity including identification of Proterra's account number, the type of tax, and a spreadsheet of the tax periods at issue (the amount of tax due will not be known until the missing returns are filed) which satisfies the City's initial obligation to proceed. The burden shifts to the Distribution Trustee to produce sufficient evidence to negate the prima facie validity of the Claim. *In re Lampe*, 665 F.3d 506, 514 (3d Cir. 2011).

6. The City's records show Proterra had tax reporting obligations for the tax periods noted in the Claim. The Distribution Trustee has not rebutted this fact nor produced any evidence to suggest that Proterra complied with its reporting/payment obligations.

7. Under these circumstances, it would be inappropriate to disallow the Claim. The Distribution Trustee has not overcome its *prima facie* validity.

8. Once the missing Wage Tax returns are filed, the City will amend its claim to include the amount owed. Any Wage Tax owed will be entitled to priority status pursuant to § 507(a)(8)(A).

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WHEREFORE, the City respectfully requests that this Court: (i) deny the Fifth Omnibus

Objection as to the Claim; (ii) allow the Claim in full; and (iii) grant such other and further relief as is just and proper.
