(f/k/a/Supply Source Enterprises, Inc.) and its affiliated debtors and debtors-in-possession (collectively, the "Debtors") in the above-captioned chapter 11 cases, hereby submits its second monthly application (the "Application") and hereby applies, pursuant to (i) sections 330 and 331 of title 11 of the United States Code, 11 U.S.C. §§ 101-1532 (the "Bankruptcy Code"), (ii) Rule 2016 of the Federal Rules of Bankruptcy Procedure (the "Bankruptcy Rules"), (iii) Rule 2016-2 of the Local Rules of Bankruptcy Practice and Procedure of the United States Bankruptcy Court for the District of Delaware (the "Local Rules"), and (iv) the Order Establishing Procedures for Interim Compensation and Reimbursement of Expenses for Retained Professionals and Granting Related Relief [Docket No. 124] (the "Interim Compensation Order"), 2 for allowance of compensation for

services rendered and reimbursement of expenses for the period from July 1, 2024 through July 31, 2024 (the "<u>Compensation Period</u>"), and respectfully represents as follows:

I. JURISDICTION, VENUE AND STATUTORY PREDICATES FOR RELIEF SOUGHT

1. This Court has jurisdiction over this Application pursuant to 28 U.S.C. §1334. This is a core proceeding pursuant to 28 U.S.C. §157(b)(2)(A) and (B). Venue of this proceeding and this Application is proper in this District pursuant to 28 U.S.C. §§1408 and 1409. The statutory predicate for the relief sought herein is section 331 of the Bankruptcy Code.

II. <u>BACKGROUND</u>

- 2. On May 21, 2024 (the "Petition Date"), the Debtors each filed a voluntary petition for relief under chapter 11 of the Bankruptcy Code. The Debtors have continued in the management of its businesses and operation of its properties pursuant to sections 1107(a) and 1108 of the Bankruptcy Code.
- 3. On June 3, 2024, the United States Trustee for Region 3 (the "<u>U.S. Trustee</u>") appointed a five-member Committee consisting of: (i) Jiangsu Bytech Medical Supplies Co., Ltd.; (ii) Xiantao Crosscare Protective Products Co., Ltd.; (iii) Xiantao Deming Healthcare Products Co., Ltd.; (iv) Hiten Nonwoven Healthcare Products (Hubei) Ltd.; and (v) Xiantao Yilin Protective Products Co., Ltd.
- 4. On June 13, 2024, this court entered the Interim Compensation Order, which sets forth the procedures for interim compensation and reimbursement of expenses in these chapter 11 cases. Among other things, the Interim Compensation Order provides that if there are no objections to a Monthly Fee Application filed within fourteen (14) days after the service of that Monthly Fee Application, the Retained Professional may file a certificate of no objection with the Court, after which the Debtors are authorized to pay such Retained Professional eighty percent

(80%) of the fees and one-hundred percent (100%) of the expenses requested in such Monthly Fee Application. If an objection is filed to the Monthly Fee Application and the parties cannot reach a consensual resolution, the Debtors are authorized to pay 80% of the fees and 100% of the expenses not subject to an unresolved objection.

5. On July 22, 2024, this court entered an *Order Approving Application to Employ Klehr Harrison Harvey Branzburg LLP as Delaware Co-Counsel to the Official Committee of Unsecured Creditors* [Docket No. 245] approving the retention of Klehr Harrison as co-counsel to the Committee effective as of the petition date.

III. <u>RELIEF REQUESTED</u>

6. Pursuant to the Interim Compensation Order and section 331 of the Bankruptcy Code, Klehr Harrison is seeking compensation in the amount of \$8,123.20, which is equal to eighty percent (80%) of \$10,154.00 in fees for professional services rendered by Klehr Harrison during the Compensation Period. This amount is derived solely from the applicable hourly billing rates of Klehr Harrison personnel who rendered services to the Committee. In addition, Klehr Harrison is seeking reimbursement of expenses incurred during the Compensation Period in the amount of \$236.43.

A. Professional Services Rendered

7. Attached hereto as "Exhibit A" is a detailed itemization, by project category, of all services performed by Klehr Harrison with respect to the chapter 11 cases during the Compensation Period. This detailed itemization complies with Local Rule 2016-2(d) in that each time entry contains a separate time allotment, a description of the type of activity and the subject matter of the activity, all time is billed in increments of one-tenth of an hour, time entries are presented chronologically in categories, and all meetings or hearings are individually identified.

8. The attorneys who rendered services related to each category are identified on Exhibit A, along with the number of hours for each individual and the total compensation sought for each category.

B. Expense Reimbursement

9. Klehr Harrison incurred out-of-pocket expenses during the Compensation Period in the amount of \$236.43. Attached hereto as "Exhibit B" is a description of the expenses actually incurred by Klehr Harrison in the performance of services rendered as co-counsel to the Committee. The expenses are broken down into categories of charges.

C. Valuation of Services

- 10. Attorneys of Klehr Harrison have expended a total of 18.60 hours in connection with this matter during the Compensation Period.
- 11. The amount of time spent by each of the professionals providing services to the Committee for the Compensation Period is set forth in Exhibit A. The rates are Klehr Harrison's normal hourly rates of compensation for work of this character. The reasonable value of the services rendered Klehr Harrison for the Compensation Period as co-counsel for the Committee in these chapter 11 cases is \$10,154.00.
- 12. Klehr Harrison also expended costs on behalf of the Committee in the sum of \$236.43 during the Compensation Period. In accordance with Local Bankruptcy Rule 2016-2(e)(iii), the line designated "Photocopying" represents in-house copying based on a cost of \$0.10 per page.
- 13. In accordance with the factors enumerated in 11 U.S.C. § 330, the amount requested is fair and reasonable given (a) the complexity of these chapter 11 cases, (b) the time

expended, (c) the nature and extent of the services rendered, (d) the value of such services, and (e) the costs of comparable services other than in a case under this title.

14. Klehr Harrison accordingly seeks allowance of the sum of \$10,154.00 in fees and \$236.43 in expenses, for a total of \$10,390.43.

D. No Prior Request

15. No prior request for the relief requested in this Application has been made to this or any other court.

WHEREFORE, Klehr Harrison hereby requests: (a) allowance of compensation for necessary and valuable professional services rendered to the Committee in the sum of \$10,154.00, and reimbursement of actual and necessary expenses incurred in the sum of \$236.43 for the period from July 1, 2024 through July 31, 2024; (b) payment in the total amount of \$8,359.63, which represents (i) 80% of the total fees billed (\$8,123.20) and (ii) 100% of the expenses incurred (\$236.43) during the Compensation Period, as provided under the Interim Compensation Order; and (c) such other relief as this Court deems just and proper.
