ORDER GRANTING LIMITED RELIEF FROM THE AUTOMATIC STAY

Antionette Windhurst, individually and as Personal Representative of the Estate of David Windhurst ("Windhurst") filed her *Motion for Relief from the Automatic Stay* (DE 1573) (the "Motion"). This Court has jurisdiction over this matter pursuant to 28 U.S.C. §1334. This is a core proceeding pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 157(b)(2), and venue is proper before this Court pursuant to 28 U.S.C. §§ 1408 and 1409.

The Court reviewed and considered the Motion, *Debtor's Objection to Antoinette Windhurst's Motion for Relief form the Automatic Stay* (DE 1594), the *Reply in Support of Windhurst's Motion for Relief from the Automatic Stay* (DE 1607), argument of counsel at the hearing on July 16, 2024, and the evidence presented and argument of counsel at the Final Hearing on August 16, 2024.

Notice of the Motion and opportunity for a hearing on the Motion were appropriate. Based on the legal and factual record, the Court orders as follows:

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the Motion is granted in part. Windhurst and the

other parties involved in Pima County Superior Court Case No. C20175978 are granted

relief from the automatic stay for the limited purpose of requesting and participating in a

hearing to set a date for trial on the merits for all pending claims.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Windhurst may not undertake any other actions

before the Superior Court at this time, including requesting or taking discovery, filing any

substantive motions, or otherwise filing motions to establish the proper party in interest,

pending the termination of the automatic stay or further order of this Court.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Windhurst may return to the Bankruptcy Court

for additional relief under the Motion, as and when she believes appropriate.
